Biographical Note

Born on May 24, 1926 in Milwaukee, Father Duffy received his priesthood formation at Saint Francis de Sales Seminary and was ordained on May 26, 1956 by the Most Reverend Albert G. Meyer, Archbishop of Milwaukee, at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist, Milwaukee.

Before taking leave from the Archdiocese of Milwaukee in 1967 to serve at Marian Centre in Regina, Saskatchewan, Canada, Father Duffy served as associate pastor at St. Bernard Parish, Wauwatosa, and St. John Parish, South Milwaukee. In 1962, he was appointed archdiocesan director of Papal Volunteer Program for Latin America (PAVLA). Father Duffy took permanent leave from the Archdiocese of Milwaukee in 1975, affiliating with the pious union/secular institute, Domus Domini of Combermere, Ontario.

Scope and Content Note a brief description of the types of materials in the collection.

Collection consists of a few articles regarding PAVALA, photographs, a small run of the Milwaukee Archdiocesan Latin American Office newsletter (1966-1973) and photographs from Madonna Manor in Fond du Lac, WI. Madonna Manor was the first training center for the lay apostolate in the Milwaukee Archdiocesan PAVLA training program.
