

Certificate of Naturalization.

Be it Remembered, That at a Circuit Court, held at Milwaukee, for the County of Milwaukee, in the State of Wisconsin, in the United States of America, on the

Third day of June in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-four

John M Henni a native of The Republic of Switzerland exhibited a Petition praying to be admitted to become a Citizen of the United States, and it appearing to the said Court that he had declared on Oath, before the Court of Common Pleas for the County of Hamilton, Ohio, on the twenty ninth day of March A. D. 1844, that it was bona-fide his intention to become a Citizen of the United States, and to RENOUNCE FOREVER all allegiance or fidelity to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State, or Sovereignty whatsoever, and particularly to The Republic of Switzerland-

of which he was at that time a citizen and the said John M Henni having on his solemn Oath declared, and also made proof thereof by competent testimony of John White & Garret W Fitzgerald citizens of the United States, that he had resided one year and upwards in the State of Wisconsin, and within the United States of America upwards of five years immediately preceding his application; and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that during that time he had behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same; and having on his solemn Oath declared before the said Court that he would support the Constitution of the United States, and that he did absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State, and Sovereignty whatsoever, and particularly to The Republic of Switzerland
of which he was before a citizen

Thereupon the Court admitted the said John M Henni to become a citizen of the United States, and ordered all proceedings aforesaid to be recorded by the Clerk of the said Court; and which was done accordingly.
