Welcome to Sustaining the Mission:

Sustaining the Mission is the official program for Religious Education Certification for educators in Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. It provides systematic, intentional content education in Catholic faith traditions and core theological teachings so that Catholic school educators may competently and confidently advance the mission of Catholic education.

This program is a collaborative effort. The Archdiocesan Office for Schools establishes the policies, such as who must attend, and has delegated the actual delivery of the program to Cardinal Stritch University's Saint Clare Center. In order to deliver the presentations, develop the curriculum, and evaluate the program, the Saint Clare Center relies on the collaborative efforts of a wide range of people working in Catholic higher education, parishes, and schools.





How the Program Works:

All educators from a group of schools gather on **one and one-half in-service days**, and instructors come to your general location. The specific location is normally scheduled by the Deanery.

On day one, participants complete 2 core curriculum classes (differentiated by level) from the curricular strand for the year (Scripture, Systematic Theology, or Prayer, Spirituality & Sacrament), as well as 2 extended learning sessions of their choosing (no distinction by level) related to that same curricular strand.

On **day two**, participants complete **2 core curriculum classes** (differentiated by level) from the curricular strand for the year.

During the two in-service days, participants will gather in school teams to share learning and consider school-level applications. This gives them **time to reflect and process in school groups.**

The curriculum for Sustaining the Mission is divided into levels.

- Level One is for participants who have no religious education certification and are
 working to attain <u>Basic</u> certification. The Level One curriculum for STM takes three
 years to complete.
- Level Two is for participants who have <u>Basic</u> religious education certification and are working to attain <u>Advanced</u> certification. The Level Two curriculum for STM takes six years to complete.
- Level Three is for participants who have completed the Level Two curriculum and who
 have <u>Advanced</u> certification. Educators in this level work in coordination with their
 principals to arrange for <u>ongoing</u> theological education and faith formation on a local or
 independent basis.





Program Goals:

Along with opportunities for prayer, worship, service, and retreat, offered by schools and parishes locally, Sustaining the Mission is an important piece of the overall faith formation program of the Catholic Schools in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. The primary goal of the program is to provide a foundational understanding of the teachings of the Catholic tradition, and how they apply to the vocation of teaching and to the mission of Catholic schools.

Overall objective:

Participants will have a heartfelt and informed faith that is connected to their lives and teaching.

Annual objectives, by curricular strand: Scripture

- 1. Participants will have a deep appreciation for the Bible as the foundation for Catholic faith, spiritual growth, and living their call.
- 2. Participants will understand the elements and application of a Catholic approach to Scripture.
- 3. Participants will have a working knowledge of the major storylines and themes of the Old Testament and the New Testament.
- 4. Participants will be able to help students use a scriptural lens in various contexts to integrate faith and life.
